✓ INSCRIÇÕES

- ✓ Não aceitaremos inscrições no local. Somente ONLINE;
- ✓ As inscrições devem ser realizadas através do novo banco de Dados do IEB, no endereço: www.servidorieb.com.br ;
- ✓ Os Associados que estiverem em dia com a Semestralidade terão 15% de desconto;

✓ ENTRADA DE PESSOAS E ANIMAIS

- ✓ A Fazenda estará aberta na sexta-feira, dia 30 de maio, a partir das 5h da manhã até às 17h, somente para os cavalos que farão a prova no sábado (01). Os cavalos da prova de domingo devem entrar no domingo, dia (02), a partir das 5h da manhã. Em hipótese alguma será permitida a entrada de animais antes desses dias e horários;
- ✓ Caso haja algum cavalo da prova de Regularidade que esteja no caminhão junto com os de Velocidade Livre, os mesmos poderão dar entrada e os piquetes serem montados;
- ✓ Na portaria principal da Fazenda terá uma lista de confirmação com os nomes de todos os inscritos. Será permitida a entrada de 1 groom por cavaleiro para as provas de Regularidade e 2 grooms para cavaleiro inscrito na velocidade livre;
- ✓ Não será permitida a entrada de acompanhantes;
- ✓ Todas as pessoas (cavaleiros, grooms, veterinários, organização...) que passarem pela portaria principal terão de aferir a temperatura e somente terá acesso após a confirmação do descarte de febre;
- ✓ Todos devem, obrigatoriamente, usar máscaras o tempo todo nas dependências do evento, com exceção do cavaleiro quando estiver montado ou na trilha;
- ✓ Após a checagem dos documentos dos animais (GTA...) os grooms deverão permanecer com os cavalos nas barracas e dirigir-se ao vet-check somente na hora da inspeção veterinária;
- ✓ Todos os participantes deverão trazer sua máscara e seu álcool-gel de casa;
- ✓ Acesso permitido para o Presidente e Diretores das Federações.

✓ **BARRACAS**

- ✓ As barracas de apoio deverão ser higienizadas com álcool gel ou álcool 70%, pelos grooms, e os mesmos devem estar utilizando máscaras e luvas;
- ✓ Todas as equipes deverão ter um saco de lixo preto na barraca e no final da prova o lixo deve ser recolhido e levado com a equipe para um descarte adequado;
- ✓ Todas as equipes deverão portar seu próprio material de apoio e de higienização e em hipótese alguma os materiais deverão ser compartilhados com outras barracas.

✓ **BAIAS**

- ✓ Acesso restrito de uma pessoa/cavalo, indicada pelo cavaleiro (favor indicar, na secretaria, o nome da pessoa que terá acesso para confecção da pulseira);
- ✓ As baias deverão ser indicadas pelo número do conjunto;
- ✓ Entrada e saída de preferência separadas e a prioridade é de quem sai, caso seja a mesma.

✓ **SECRETARIA**

- ✓ Não aceitaremos inscrições no local;
- ✓ A retirada do colete será feita pelo cavaleiro e deverá ser vestido na frente da secretária. Em hipótese nenhuma será entregue ao groom.

✓ **LARGADA E CHEGADA**

- ✓ Os grooms não poderão acompanhar os cavaleiros na largada;
- ✓ O conjunto deve se preparar na sua barraca e se dirigir para a largada somente 5 (cinco) minutos antes do horário marcado;
- ✓ Os grooms devem permanecer nas barracas e só se dirigir para a chegada no horário estabelecido;
- ✓ Após o resfriamento do cavalo, somente o cavaleiro ou o groom entra no vet-check;
- ✓ Os grooms deverão recepcionar os cavalos somente após a higienização das barracas e das mãos e sempre com a máscara.

✓ **TRILHAS**

- ✓ Não haverá apoio nas provas de Regularidade;
- ✓ Nas provas de Velocidade Livre haverá apoio de uma única pessoa junto às tinas de água;
- ✓ As tinas estarão distantes 10 metros umas das outras, num total de 3 tinas e solicitamos aos atletas que mantenham distância no uso das tinas;
- ✓ Quem estiver com caminhonete e for ao Pit, deve manter distância das tinas, levando água própria, e neste caso poderá haver 2 grooms, desde que sejam do mesmo haras;

- ✓ Todos que fizerem apoio devem portar máscaras e luvas e só usarem os seus próprios regadores e baldes, não os emprestando de forma alguma;
- ✓ Caso o apoio sirva água ou hidratante ao atleta, solicitamos a higienização dos recipientes no local, portanto devem levar álcool em gel e álcool 70% nos pits;
- ✓ Cada cavaleiro deve levar água para consumo próprio durante o percurso da trilha;
- ✓ Só haverá água para os cavalos, a cada 10km;

✓ **VET CHECK**

- ✓ Na apresentação do cavalo, somente uma pessoa, com máscara, poderá acompanhar e trotar o animal;
- ✓ Não será permitido e nem necessário que o groom esteja com o colete do cavaleiro para apresentar o cavalo no vet;
- ✓ Quem estiver acompanhando o cavalo deve manter uma distância de um metro e meio do veterinário;
- ✓ Caso tenhamos 4 (quatro) conjuntos dentro do vet-check, o 5º (quinto) só poderá entrar quando um deles sair. Não haverá penalidade por atraso de entrada em decorrência do número de conjuntos limitados a 4 (quatro) dentro do vet;
- ✓ A entrada e saída do vet devem ser obrigatoriamente separadas.

Orientação para os organizadores de eventos da CBH durante o atual surto de COVID-19

Tendo em vista o atual surto de COVID-19, esta lista de verificação de mitigação e avaliação de riscos para organização de eventos foi desenvolvida pela OMS para uso pelos países e organizadores eventos, com o objetivo de avaliar o risco específico de contaminação para o COVID-19.

A partir da adaptação da FEI para a matriz desenvolvida pela OMS e de acordo com a Política da CBH para aumentar a segurança das competições durante a pandemia de Covid-19, para os eventos oficiais que ocorrerem a partir da data de publicação desta, todas as federações, os Comitês Organizadores e as entidades de prática devem realizar uma avaliação de risco de seu evento com relação a transmissão/contaminação do Covid-19, usando o presente documento.

Esta avaliação de risco e a lista de verificação de mitigação deve ser usada em conjunto com as "Considerações para federações esportivas / organizadores de eventos esportivos ao planejar *reuniões de massa* no contexto do COVID-19" emitido pela OMS - os OCs devem considerar o termo "reunião de massa" nele como sinônimo de "Evento", neste contexto.

Para fornecer respostas precisas ao seguinte questionário de verificação para a avaliação de mitigação de riscos, os Comitês Organizadores devem ter conhecimento do atual surto de COVID-19; Os COs devem conhecer os relatórios diários da situação global do COVID-19 fornecidos pela OMS, bem como os relatórios estaduais e municipais de situação do COVID-19, se disponíveis.

Esta avaliação deve ser respondido nesta planilha do Excel (consulte as pastas a seguir), pois as pontuações são calculadas automaticamente. Após o preenchimento, as pontuações recebidas ao final da planilha do Excel para ambas as seções aparecerão na matriz de decisão encontrada na pasta final ("Pontuações gerais de risco") para determinar a pontuação geral de risco do Evento.

O Comitê Organizador deve assegurar que essa avaliação de risco seja efetuada com a colaboração das autoridades locais de saúde pública e que o pessoal necessário, com experiência em eventos esportivos que possam avaliar os riscos, epidemiológicos e as medidas de controle de doenças infecciosas, sejam incluídos nos estágios iniciais do planejamento.

Para a determinação final, os fatores em consideração incluem:

- O estágio atual do surto de COVID-19 e a dinâmica de transmissão conhecida
- A distribuição geográfica e número de participantes, e seu perfil de risco individual
- O questionário de avaliação de risco
- As medidas de mitigação atualmente existentes ou viáveis e qualquer orientação específica da disciplina emitida pela CBH/FEI.

É importante lembrar que, embora as medidas de mitigação possam reduzir o risco de infecções por COVID-19, elas não garantem a eliminação completa da ameaça de risco. A OMS apóia as melhores práticas de distanciamento social e recomenda a todos os países com alta taxa de transmissão do vírus considerar seriamente adiar ou reduzir eventos esportivos com aglomeração de pessoas e que tenham potencial para ampliar a transmissão da doença. Qualquer decisão sobre a realização ou não dos eventos, será embasada nas recomendações e neste questionário da OMS de avaliação de riscos.

Se medidas nacionais, estaduais e/ou municipais relativas a restrição de movimentação de pessoas forem implementadas elas serão soberanas as medidas de mitigação recomendadas neste questionário de avaliação de risco.

No entanto, quando o processo de reabertura / realização de eventos for considerado com restrições, será fundamental garantir que todas as decisões sejam baseadas na avaliação de risco COVID-19 da OMS.

Avaliação de Risco para COVID-19

As perguntas abaixo permitirão aos C.O. e Entidades de Práticas revisar as considerações adicionais específicas ao esporte e, assim, informar a avaliação de risco do COVID-19 associado ao seu Evento. Isso ajudará os C.O. a entender e gerenciar qualquer risco adicional do COVID-19.

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

6.3 Examination On Arrival

FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1031

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status, concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

6.5 Limb Sensitivity Examination

FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1048-1053

All Horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event. For Jumping that includes, but is not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. For Endurance that includes, but is not limited to, pre-ride, during the ride and after the ride. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event.

Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

7 Equine Anti-Doping And Controlled Medication Programme (EADCMP).

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VII

7.1 Sampling.

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VII

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMPs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

7.2 Elective Testing.

FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1058

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of Prohibited Substances. Please refer to <http://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/veterinarians> for information and details.

7.3 Hyposensitivity Control System Examination

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Annex VIII

All horses competing in FEI Endurance events are subject to Hyposensitivity Control System Examination. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of the Event and may be selected randomly and/or target tested by the Ground Jury and/or Veterinary Commission.

All horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination. A refusal by the PR or his/her representative to submit a horse for examination will lead to disqualification and a yellow warning card. Withdrawal of the horse is not allowed once the PR or support personnel has been notified that the examination is to take place.

XIV. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any FEI Event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested by the FEI as outlined in article 22.3 of the FEIs' Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA).

XV. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. THE FEI POLICY FOR ENHANCED COMPETITION SAFETY DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The FEI Policy for Enhanced Competition Safety during the Covid-19 Pandemic (“Policy”) <https://inside.fei.org/fei/covid-19/return-to-play/policy-tools> is mandatory and applies for any FEI Event taking place **as of 1 July 2020**. The Policy has been developed based on currently accepted best practices by the WHO and US Center for Disease Control (CDC) and will be continually reviewed and updated as more information becomes available. It is not intended to replace the applicable guidance and policies from domestic government and health authorities, but to supplement their recommendations with sport specific considerations.

The OC shall submit the risk assessment and mitigation plan (including name and contact details of the person in charge) to the FEI as an annex to the Event Schedule, **at the latest ten (10) working days before the event’s deadline for Definite Entries**.

Events for which the FEI has not received the documented risk assessment and mitigation measures plan in accordance with article 2.1.g) of the Policy **will be removed from the FEI calendar** in accordance with Article 112.3 of the FEI General Regulations.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK / WAIVER OF LIABILITY

In consideration of being allowed to participate in the Event and related activities, all Participants (as defined in the Policy) acknowledge, appreciate, and agree that:

1. Participation includes possible exposure to and illness from infectious diseases including but not limited to COVID-19. While particular rules and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious illness and death does exist; and,
2. The Participants knowingly and freely assume all such risks, both known and unknown, even if arising from the negligence of the OC or others, and assume full responsibility for their participation; and,
3. The Participants willingly agree to comply with the stated and customary terms and conditions for participation as regards protection against infectious diseases. If, however, a Participant observes any unusual or significant hazard during his/her presence or participation, the Participant will remove himself/herself from participation and bring such to the attention of the nearest official immediately; and,
4. The Participants, for themselves and on behalf of their heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, HEREBY RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS THE OC AND THE FEI, their officers, officials, agents, and/or employees, other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, and if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event (“RELEASEES”), WITH RESPECT TO ANY AND ALL ILLNESS, DISABILITY, DEATH, or loss or damage to person or property, WHETHER ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF RELEASEES OR OTHERWISE, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

The Participants confirm to have read this release of liability and assumption of risk agreement, fully understand its terms, understand that they have given up substantial rights.

2. Insurances And National Requirements

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe, host NF delegate, if any, and the Ground Jury, the Organiser may change the schedule in order to clarify any matter arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Technical Delegate.

2.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

2.1.1 Personal Accident and Health Insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

2.1.2 Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an FEI Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

2.1.3 Press Equipment

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organising Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.

2.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS

2.2.1 Third Party Liability Insurance

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to FEI Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

2.2.2 Additional Liability Information

2.2.3 Horse Insurance

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a FEI Event.

[FEI Permitted Treating Veterinarians \(PTVs\) \(Art 1005\) are to have adequate professional indemnity insurance.](#)

3. Protests / Appeals

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF150. – or equivalent.

4. Disputes

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

5. Modifications Of Schedule

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances.

Unforeseen circumstances do not include situations arising as a result of the OC altering the approved Schedule without FEI's authorisation. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

The tax form should be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the organiser prior to departing.

Please note that as per Art. 109.6 (GR): ORGANISERS of International Events must inform the FEI and NFs whose teams or individuals have taken part, of the results and prize money paid to each placed Athlete and team, within five (5) days following the Event, unless otherwise specified for qualification and ranking reasons as communicated by the FEI.

Failure from ORGANISERS of International Events to provide the FEI with the appropriate result(s) and/or prize money information by the aforesaid deadline and/or in the aforesaid format shall entail a warning for the first violation and thereafter a fine of CHF 1'000.- per violation.

The FEI may request a copy of the official PDF result signed by the relevant Officials at the Event.

FEI Endurance Organisers' Protocol

With an aim to further ensure the welfare of equine and human athletes at International Endurance Events, the safety of all participants and the implementation and respect of common principles of behaviour, fairness, and sportsmanship, the FEI has created this FEI Endurance Organiser's Protocol (hereinafter the "Endurance Protocol") to guarantee the correct and full application of the applicable FEI Rules and Regulations in your Events, in particular but not limited to, the FEI General Regulations, the FEI Endurance Rules, the FEI Veterinary Regulations, the FEI Anti-Doping Rules for Human Athletes and the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations.

In order for the FEI to approve the competition schedules the Endurance Protocol **must** be signed by the Organiser and the National Federation, listing the Event(s). By signing the Endurance Protocol both aforementioned parties agree to comply with all applicable FEI Rules and Regulations, and in particular (but not limited to), with the following requirements:

1. Full cooperation must be given to the FEI Officials to ensure that they can perform their tasks according to the FEI Endurance Rules, in particular:
 - Ground Jury Art. – Art. 853
 - Technical Delegate – Art. 852
 - Veterinary Commission – Art. 854
 - Chief Steward Art. – Art. 855

2. Full cooperation must be given to the FEI Independent Governance Advisors (IGAs) to ensure that they can perform their tasks according to the FEI Endurance Rules Art. 856

3. The welfare of the horse must be a first priority and you must allow the FEI Officials to take all necessary measures to safeguard it, as per the FEI Endurance Rules, including but not limited to:
 - Loops of the course must not be specially designed and/or constructed to encourage high speeds - Art. 818
 - Allowing for the reduction of the pulse criteria - Art. 816.9.2. The pulse criteria may be reduced during the ride if, in the opinion of the President of the Veterinary Commission in consultation with the Foreign Veterinary Delegate, the President of the Ground Jury and the Technical Delegate they believe there is a danger to the safety of the Horses.
 - The Veterinary Commission has absolute control on all matters concerning horse welfare – Annex 5, Art.1.
 - The Technical Delegate or the Ground Jury together with the Veterinary Commission can decide to modify the length of timed holds according to extreme weather conditions or other exceptional circumstances.... - Art. 816.9.3.

4. The safety of the athletes, FEI Officials and public must be safeguarded at all times and FEI Officials must be allowed to take all necessary measures to ensure safety, as per the FEI Endurance Rules/FEI GRs:
 - The field of play - Art. 813
 - Number of crew members allowed - Art. 813.2.2
 - Horses must remain capable of being clearly observed at all times - Art. 813.5
 - Permitted Assistance during Event or on Course - Art. 822.4
 - Prohibited Assistance - Art. 822.5
 - Postponement and/or cancellation of an Event - FEI GRs 109.12

5. The FEI Officials' Code of Conduct must be adhered to including the obligations and restrictions pertaining to the "Endurance Official's Per Diems".


Any breach of the FEI Rules and Regulations will be prosecuted according to the FEI Legal System (Chapter VIII of the FEI General Regulations).
